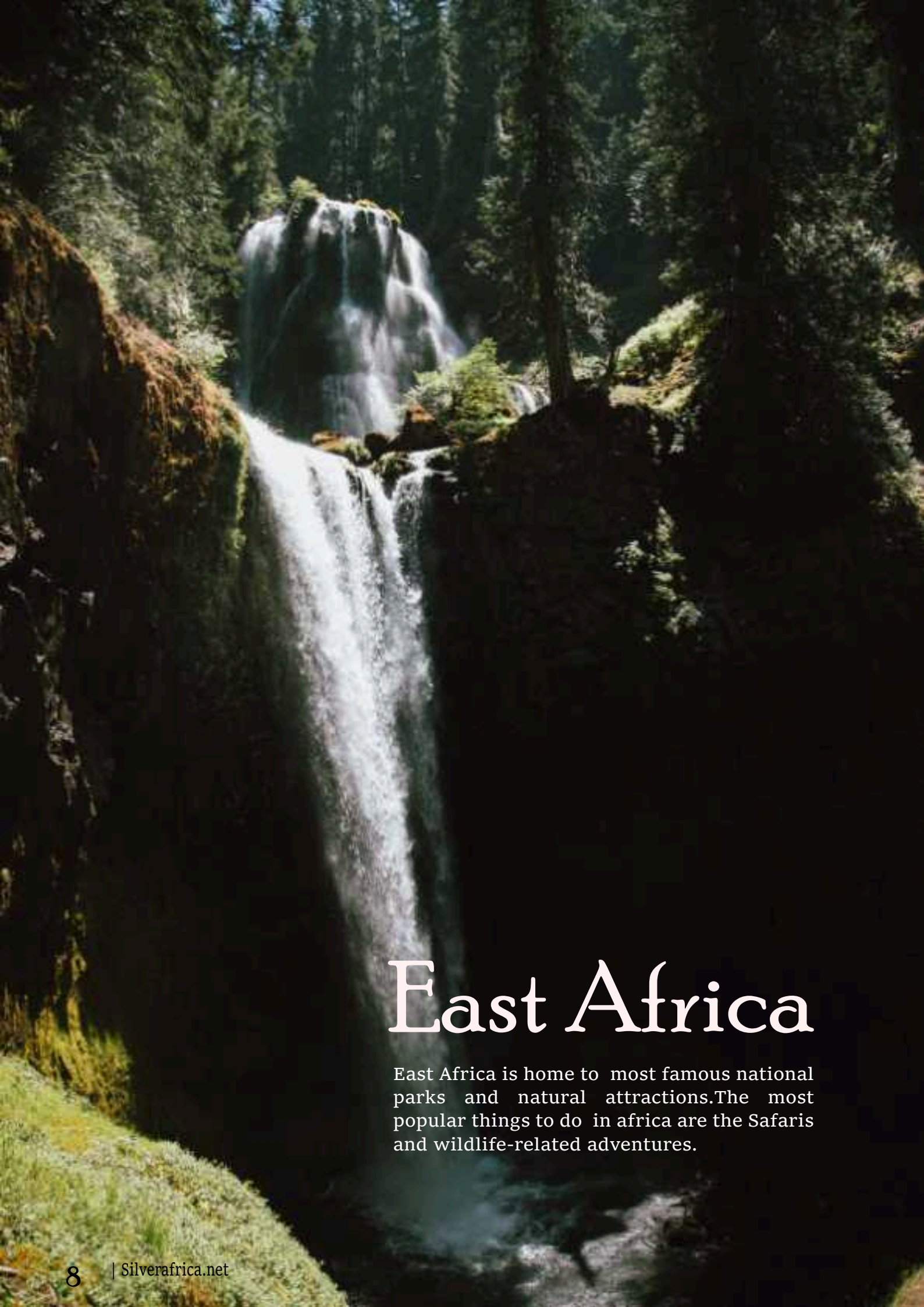

East Africa

East Africa is home to most famous national parks and natural attractions. The most popular things to do in Africa are the Safaris and wildlife-related adventures.



Kenya

Kenya is a country in East Africa with coastlines on the Indian Ocean. At 580,367km² (224,081 sq mi), Kenya is the world's 48th largest country by area. It has a population of more than 48 million and is thus considered the 29th most populous country in the world. Kenya is divided into eight provinces, namely: Nairobi, Central, Eastern, North Eastern, Coast, Nyanza, Rift Valley, and Western.

It encompasses savannah, Lakelands, the dramatic Great Rift Valley, and mountain highlands. It is famed for its scenic landscapes and vast wildlife preserves.

Its Indian Ocean coast is historically important since it served as a port by which goods from Arabian and Asian traders have entered the continent for

many centuries. Along that coast are some of the finest beaches in Africa and are predominantly Muslim Swahili cities such as Mombasa, Lamu, Malindi, and Diani.

Inland are populous highlands famed for both their tea plantations and their variety of animal species. Kenya's western provinces, marked by lakes and rivers, are forested, while a small portion of the north is desert and semi-desert. Kenya undoubtedly is one of the world's leading safari destinations

Why Visit Kenya

1. Amazing Weather, all year round;

Since Kenya is on the equator belt, it has a beautiful tropical climate throughout the year. There is, however, a dry and a wet season.

2. The Great Wildebeest Migration;

Also known as the world's 8th wonder, the Great Wildebeest Migration is the largest herd movement of animals on earth. It involves the movement of over 1.2 million wildebeests and 300,000 zebras and a number of topi alongside other gazelles from the Serengeti - Mara Ecosystems in search of greener pastures and water yearly.

3. The Big Five Animals Safari Destination - Maasai Mara National Reserve;

It is the most famous park and the epicenter for wildlife in Kenya.

4. Great Bush and Beach Safari Destination;

This is a great safari combo where in the morning you can be in search of the big 5 in direct flights from the Mara to Ditha wild and be sipping cocktails on the beach by sundown. This is made possible with air or from the Mara through Nairobi (Wilson) to Lamu Island.



5. Exclusive and Private Conservancies;

6. The Rich Culture;

Kenya is home to many different ethnic and cultural groups, with more than 40 ethnic groups recorded so far. A safari with Silver Africa Tours and Safaris gives you a chance to meet the Swahili sailors of the coast, visit the thorn-enclosed villages of the Maasai in the south, and walk alongside Samburu warriors in the northern wilderness, or fish with the Luo on Lake Victoria in the west.

7. Great Lakes;

Kenya, being part of the African Great Lakes Region is home to 46 and contains 9.5% of the African lakes. A chain of 8 lakes is found within Kenya's Great Rift Valley and none of these lakes have a clear outflow. Only two of these lakes contain freshwater.

8. Brilliant Birdlife;

Kenya is best known as a real twitcher's paradise. With over 1,100 recorded species, the nation is known as one of Africa's best birding destinations.

the heritage of a place is what sets it apart from other places. The country holds seven UNESCO World Heritage Sites, making it second only to South Africa which has 10.

10. Underwater National Parks

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No ecological realm can be quieter than the underwater world. Underwater national parks allow people to truly experience the diversity of the area's sea life.

Kenya Safari Experiences

Safari experiences are tours and activities which can be incorporated as part of a bespoke tailor-made itinerary.

1. City Tours

Kenya has only four incorporated cities; Nairobi- the capital and the largest city, Mombasa –the second largest and the coastal city, Kisumu- the third largest and an inland port city, and the newly elevated city of Nakuru which was upgraded from a municipality to a city. There is a wide range of enticing activities and attractions to be enjoyed in these cities.

2. Boat Rides A boat ride is a great way of exploring the Kenyan shores and islands. From lake Naivasha to the coastal part of the nation, a boat ride is a great way to enjoy beautiful views as you sail through the waters.

3. Hot Air Balloon Safaris

This is a 1hour flight where you are lifted –off at dawn rising with the sun and gently floating in whichever direction the winds of the morning take you. At times this balloon will be piloted at the treetop level offering unique perspectives of the wildlife and many great photo opportunities.

4. Cultural Village Visits

Immerse yourself in an authentic community culture as you visit a traditional village. Get to interact with the locals as you learn their way of life. During your visit, you can enjoy listening to local storytellers, and local musicians and watch performances such as dances.



5. Private Conservancies

Private conservancies are important because of the positive impact they have on conservation and the improvement of the lives of the local communities. If you choose to stay in a private conservancy, you're able to experience a crowd-free game viewing, night game drives, the freedom of your guide to go off-road and the option of doing guided nature walks.

6. Animal Sanctuaries

Animal Sanctuaries allow one-on-one interaction with wild animals since they have a good interaction with humans. Some of these animal sanctuaries in Kenya actually began as homes for young orphaned and endangered wild animals. They are taken care of until they are strong enough to be released back to the wild.

Kenya Safari Tourism Circuits

Kenya is divided into small tourism destinations which are called the tourism circuits. It has over 40 parks and reserves with 24 national parks, 15 national reserves, 6 marine parks, and private conservancies as listed below.

Nairobi Tourism Circuit

Nairobi is Kenya's capital city. It is situated in South Central Kenya, south of the Equator. Nairobi has quite a number of attractions to be explored by anyone visiting Kenya, with only one national park – Nairobi National Park.



Nairobi National Park – “The World’s only Wildlife Capital.”

It was the first national park established in Kenya. It is located south of Nairobi, with an area of 117km². It is home to the black rhinos in Kenya and has a Rhino Sanctuary that has about 76 indigenous black rhinos and 13 white rhinos.

Other Tourist Attractions in Nairobi: the Giraffe Centre, Nairobi National Museum, Karen Blixen Museum, David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust, Nairobi Animal Orphanage, Karura Forest, Nairobi Safari Walk, Railway Museum, Bomas of Kenya, Kenyatta International Convention Centre

Central Kenya Tourism Circuit

Central Kenya is a land of mountain peaks, picturesque waterfalls, and remote alpine moors that offer a quirky and breathtaking African landscape. This circuit’s highlight activities include hiking, mountain climbing, kayaking, game viewing; with high chances of seeing all the Big 5, the

endangered black rhino, and the rare forest antelopes like the bongo, scenic views of hills, and spectacular waterfalls.

This circuit has three national parks, namely; Aberdare National Park, Mount Kenya National Park, and Mount Longonot National Park.

Aberdare National Park – ‘Majestic Peaks, Moorlands, and Intriguing Falls’

This is a protected area in the Aberdare Mountain Range. It is located East of the East Africa Rift Valley, with an area of 767km². It provides a habitat for elephants, black rhinos, olive baboons, spotted hyenas, colobus monkeys, warthogs, buffalos, baboons, and many others. Rare sightings in this park include the Giant Forest hog, bongo, golden cat, serval cat, African wild cat, African civet cat, and blue duiker.

Park Activities: Game viewing, Trekking, Bird watching, Camping, and Photography.

Mount Kenya National Park – “Come touch the sky”

This park was established in 1949 with an aim of protecting Mount Kenya – the second largest mountain in Africa, the wildlife, and the surrounding environment. It covers an area of 715km². It is a pristine wilderness with lakes, tarns, glaciers, dense forest, mineral springs, and a selection of rare and endangered species of animals, high altitude adapted plains game, and unique montane and alpine vegetation.

Park activities: Game viewing, Mountain climbing, Camping, and Cave exploration.

Mount Longonot National Park – “Sheer Adventure”

This park is located southwest region of Kenya and southeast of Lake Naivasha, with an area of 154km². Although not majorly known for wildlife, at lower elevations, visitors can hope to see buffaloes, giraffes, elands, lions, bushbucks, zebra, and Grant’s gazelle.

Park Activities: Game viewing, Hiking, Biking, Rock climbing, Walking

South Rift Tourism Circuit

This circuit is the most popular and has the best-known attractions in Kenya. It consists of the top-ranked destinations in the nation. It is the perfect circuit for nature lovers, wildlife safaris, and photography. It is filled with breathtaking sceneries and a huge population of animals.

This circuit has four national parks, namely; Hell gate National Park – located very close to Naivasha, Lake Nakuru National Park – famed for its

large flamingo population and its rhino sanctuary, Maasai Mara National Reserve – located on the northernmost point of the famous wildebeest migration across the Serengeti plains, and The Mara Triangle





Hell's Gate National Park – “A Walk on the Wild Side”

Named for the intense geothermal activity within its boundaries, the Hell's Gate National Park is a remarkable quarter of the Great Rift Valley. This park lies south of Lake Naivasha and northwest of Nairobi. It is named after a narrow break in the cliffs, once a tributary of a prehistoric lake that fed early humans in the rift valley. This park covers an area of 68.25km². Spectacular scenery including the towering cliffs, water-gouged gorges, stark rock towers, scrub-clad volcanoes, and belching plumes of geothermal steam make it one of the most atmospheric Parks in Africa.

Park Activities: Biking, Bird watching, Game viewing, Hiking, Rock climbing

Lake Nakuru National Park – “A beautiful Wildlife Haven”

Lake Nakuru National Park is located in the southwestern part of Kenya. It lies on the floor of the Great Rift Valley, surrounded by wooded and bushy grasslands. The national park encompasses an area of 188km². 27% of the park is composed of Lake Nakuru waters

and was established as a national park in 1961. The park was declared a rhino sanctuary in 1983 and currently has approximately 45 black and 31 white rhinoceros.

.The park is also a sanctuary for Rothschild's Giraffe and has a large reserve of over 300 species of birds.

Park activities: Game Viewing, Camping, and Bird Watching.

Maasai Mara National Reserve

Maasai Mara National Reserve is situated in the southwestern part of Kenya along the border of Tanzania and is contiguous with the neighboring Serengeti National Park. It stretches across an area of 1,510km². The park is divided into two more areas; the inner portion which features pristine wilderness and the outer portion which allows grazing of the Maasai people's cattle. This reserve delivers many attractions as it is home to an excellent-year-round concentration of game.

Popular wildlife that might be seen include all African Big 7, hippo, giraffe, roan antelope, gazelle, zebra, baboon, eland, etc.

Park Activities: Game viewing, Bush dinners, Sundowners, Balloon safaris, Bushwalks, Maasai Village Visits, etc.



The Mara Triangle

This is the southwestern part of the Maasai Mara National Reserve and is managed by the Mara Conservancy. The Mara Triangle forms about a third of the Maasai Mara National Reserve with an area of 510km².

The unique feature of the Mara Triangle is the Oloololo

escarpment, the Mara River, and the international boundary which forms a triangular shape. It is less visited and less crowded with a fairly good concentration of wildlife all year round, including the Big5 and the diverse plains game such as cheetah, hyena, jackal, wildebeest, zebra, giraffe, and many other species.

North Rift Tourism Circuit

This circuit institutes the most remote and often beyond reach attractions that are considered adventurous for those seeking to explore this nature at its most rugged. This circuit appeals to tourists because of its hot springs, lakes, and bird sanctuaries. This circuit has three national parks and four national reserves, namely; Sibiloi National Park, south and Central National Park, Marsabit National Reserve, Laikipia National Reserve, Nasalot National Reserve, and South Turkana National Reserve.

Sibiloi National Park – “The Cradle of mankind”

Sibiloi National Park is situated on the northeastern shore of Lake Turkana in northern Kenya. This park covers an area of 1,570km². It is home to important archeological sites such as Koobi Fora. The park was named after Mount Sibiloi.

It is characterized by semi-desert and open plains flanked by volcanic formations. Terrestrial wildlife includes zebras, Grant gazelles, lions, leopards, striped hyenas, Beisa Oryx, greater kudu, cheetahs, and northern topi among others.

Park Activities; Archeological safaris, bird watching, camping, game viewing, fishing



Central Island National Park – “The Gem of Lake Turkana”

This park is found on an island (also known as crocodile island) on the world’s desert permanent lake – Lake Turkana. This park covers an area of 5km², relatively small but offers an unforgettable tourist experience. Central island is made up of three active volcanoes that belch sulphurous smoke and steam. It has three active lakes (Crocodile lake, Flamingo lake, Tilapia lake) that provide breeding grounds for the world’s largest breeding concentration of Nile crocodiles.

Park Activities; Game viewing, bird watching, fishing, boat rides, camping.

South Island National Park – “The Isle of Mystery”

This park is located on an island in the southern area of Lake Turkana. It is the biggest island in the lake covering an area of 39km². Covered end to end in volcanic ash, the nightly glow of its South Island’s luminous vents has inspired

numerous tales of ghosts and evil spirits. It is home to a profusion of birdlife. 34 species of European migrants are most spectacularly viewed as they return home between March and May. At least 23 species breed here, including the Goliath heron, and African skimmer. Birds of prey are also abundant, especially swallow-tailed kites. It has one of the world’s largest concentrations of crocodiles.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching.

Marsabit National Park & Reserve – “ A remote Paradise for nature lovers”

This is a national park and nature reserve in northern Kenya. It derives its name from Mount Marsabit.

It covers an area of 1,554km². Its reserve is known for its population and bird sanctuary. The area contains a number of extinct volcanic craters which are covered in forests. This park is a refuge for huge tusked bull elephants, diverse birdlife, and reptiles.

Park Activities; Game Viewing, Bird Watching, Hiking.

Laikipia National Reserve

Located in the central highlands of Kenya, the plateau extends from Mt. Kenya to the east and Rift Valley to the west. After Maasai Mara, Laikipia has the biggest and most diverse mammal population in Kenya. It covers an area of 9,500km², second in size only to Tsavo National Park. This reserve not only shelters the Big Five but a variety of rare and endangered species, including the African wild dog, Grevy's zebra, and the semi-aquatic sitatunga antelope. What formally consisted of ranch land is today a mosaic of private game reserves as well as community-owned sanctuaries.

Park Activities; Day & Night game drives, bush walks, horseback excursions.

Nasolot National Reserve

This beautiful and rugged reserve is located to the north of mount Melo. It is named after the Nasolot Hill. It covers an area of 92km².

It is quite remote and thus less visited.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching, Fishing, Camping, Nature walks.

South Turkana National Reserve

This reserve covers an area of 1,091km² and is located in the foothills of mount Nasolot near Lake Turkana. It is made up of a rugged landscape covered in seasonal river beds, patches of dry savannah grasses, and thorny bushes. This reserve is less visited because it experiences a dry season all through the year. Although it is low on plains game, it is worth a visit for the large expanses of mixed vegetation and the landscape.

Park Activities; Game viewing.



Eastern Tourism Circuit

The Eastern Tourism Circuit stretches through the dry areas of eastern Kenya, covering the areas of Samburu and the eastern foothills of Mount Kenya. This circuit is made up of picturesque sceneries, iconic physical features such as the slopes of Mount Meru, and a wide range of wildlife.

This circuit has 3 national parks and 4 national reserves, namely; Meru National Park, Ol Donyo Sabuk National Park, Kora National Park, Sheba National Reserve, Bisanadi National Reserve, Buffalo Springs National Reserve, Mwea National Reserve, Mwingi National Reserve, and Samburu National Reserve.

Meru National Park – “Complete Wilderness”

Meru National Park is located east of Meru, covering an area of 870km². Brilliant on a magnificent scale, this park feature luxuriant jungle, coursing rivers, verdant swamp, khaki grasslands, and gaunt termite cathedrals all under the sky's great blue bowl. Aside from the scenery and wildlife, tourist attractions include the once home of George and Joy Adamson, Adamson's Falls, the burial sites of Joy Adamson and Elsa the Lioness, views of Mount Kenya, and the Tana River.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Camping.

Kora National Park – “The Last Wilderness”

Kora National Park is located in Tana River county, covering an area of 1,788km². The park was initially gazetted as a nature reserve in 1973, which was then as a national park in 1989 following the murder of George Adamson by poachers. Home to the Adamsons' Camp - Kampi ya Simba - the former home of George and Joy Adamson, this park offers a pristine wilderness dotted with tall inselbergs and graced by the Tana River on which the Adamson's Falls, Grand Falls, and Kora Rapids are found.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Camping, Fishing.

Ol Donyo Sabuk National Park – “Ultimate Panoramic Experience”

Ol Donyo Sabuk, means large mountain in Maasai. Ol Donyo Sabuk covers an area of 20.7km². Dominated by a small mountain covered in montane forest, this park is home to 45 species of birds. Buffalo are the dominant animals in the ecosystem and other wildlife include bushbucks, leopards, olive baboons, aardvarks, porcupines, mongoose, pythons, and monitor lizard.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Camping, Mountain climbing.





Mwea National Reserve - “An Undiscovered Oasis of Tranquility” Mwea National Reserve is a nature reserve located within Mbeere District, in Eastern Province.

It covers an area of 42km² and is dominated by the Acacia-Commiphora bushland, typically a savannah ecosystem. Open grasslands are dominant along the main rivers, with occasional thick undergrowth,

as well as a riparian or riverine woodland. The ecosystem’s main features are the meeting point of rivers Tana and Thiba, Kamburu, and Masinga hydroelectric dams, which harbor a variety of biodiversity. Renowned for its water birds and waders, over 200 species of birds have been recorded in the reserve.

It also shelters two other rare species; the Pel's fishing owl and the white-backed night heron.

The Malagasy pond heron is also a common sighting. Game species range from African elephants, lesser kudus, Nile crocodiles, giraffes, Grant's zebras, buffalos,

African leopards, common duikers, black-backed jackals, bushbucks, waterbucks, Sykes monkeys, warthogs, rock hyraxes, bush pigs, impalas, and hartebeests.

Striped ground squirrels, Common Genet Cat, and yellow baboons are also found in Mwea.

Park Activities; Game viewing and bird watching. Bisanadi National Reserve - “Paradise Unspoiled” This is a wildlife reserve located in Isiolo County, Kenya.

It is adjacent to Meru National Park and covers an area of about 600km².

This hot and arid bushland is host to many species of mammals including lions, elephants, cheetahs, rhinos, buffalos, and over 400 species of birds.

Park Activities; Game viewing, bird watching, and fishing. Shaba National Reserve This is a protected area in Isiolo County, northern Kenya.

It covers an area of 130km². The Shaba reserve has dramatic scenery including river-side forests, scattered woodlands, and dry grasslands dominated by the

Shaba Hill volcano. The plentiful wildlife relies on waterholes and marshes scattered throughout the reserve. Shaba is home to the endangered Grevy's zebra and

the rare Williams's lark.

Park Activities; Game viewing



Buffalo Springs National Reserve

The Buffalo Springs National Reserve is named after an oasis of clear water at its western end. It covers an area of 131km². The main feature is the Champagne Ride in the southeast, an ancient lava terrace. Vegetation includes acacia tortilis woodland and large stretches of bushland dominated by Commiphora. Wildlife includes Grant's zebra and the endangered Grevy's Zebra. Other species of mammal include the reticulated giraffe, the African bush elephant, Oryx, gerenuk, African buffalo, lion, leopard, cheetah, and hyena. Over 365 species of bird have been recorded in the reserve.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching, Fishing

Samburu National Reserve

Samburu National Reserve is a game reserve situated at the southeastern corner of Samburu District. This vast expanse of remote pristine wilderness measures 165km² in size and borders the Ewaso Ng'iro River to the south, which separates it from the Buffalo Springs National Reserve. It is a unique wildlife conservation haven famous for an abundance of rare species of animals such as the Grevy's Zebra, Somali Ostrich, Reticulated Giraffe, Gerenuk, and the Beisa Oryx. The reserve is also home to a population of close to 900 Elephants. Wild dog sightings are also a common attraction to this unique protected area and Birdlife is abundant with over 450 recorded species.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching.

Mwingi Game Reserve – “The Last Frontier”

Formally known as Kitui North National Reserve, Mwingi Game Reserve is located north of Mwingi town and covers an area of 745km². Mwingi Game Reserve is one of four protected and contiguous areas that comprise the 4,400km² Meru Conservational Area (MCA). The other three are Meru National Park, Bisanadi National Reserve, and Kora National Park. Mwingi National Reserve borders all three and is the least accessible. Hot, dry, remote, and unspoiled, this reserve is designated a Wilderness Activity Zone. Wildlife populations are low, but there are hippos, crocodiles, buffalo, and warthog.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Fishing, Boat rides.

Southern Tourism Circuit

The southern tourism circuit is dominated by Tsavo, Kenya's largest national park. This is the best circuit for scenic view lovers and wildlife addicts. It consists of four national parks, namely; Tsavo East National Park, Tsavo West National Park, Chyulu Hills National Park, and Amboseli National Park.





Tsavo West National Park – “Land of Lava, Springs, Man-Eaters and Magical Sunsets”

Tsavo West National Park is located in southeastern Kenya and a little southeast of the sister Tsavo East National Park.

It covers an area of 9,065km² making it smaller than its sister park. It is a beautiful, rugged wilderness. The savannah ecosystem comprises open grasslands, scrublands, Acacia woodlands, belts of riverine vegetation, and rocky ridges. It is more mountainous and more diverse in its landscape.

The Big 5 are all accounted for within Tsavo West. Other popular species include hartebeest, kudu, giraffe, buffalo, and hippopotamus. It also has abundant birdlife including the threatened corncrake and near threatened Basra Reed Warbler.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching, Cave exploration, Underwater Hippo, and Fish watching.

Other Tourist Attractions; Mzima Springs, Shetani lava, Rhino Sanctuary.

Tsavo East National Park – “Theatre of the wild”

Tsavo East National Park is located in southeastern Kenya and a little northwest of the sister Tsavo West National Park. It covers an area of 13,747km². The park forms the largest protected area in Kenya and is home to most of the larger mammals, vast herds of dust-red elephant, Rhino, buffalo, lion, leopard, pods of hippo, crocodile, waterbucks, lesser Kudu, gerenuk, and the prolific birdlife features 500 recorded species.

The park is comprised of grasslands and savanna and riverbeds created by the Tsavo and Athi rivers which combine into the Galana River. Other wildlife species include aardwolf, baboon, buffalo, bushbuck, dik-dik, duiker, eland, elephant, gazelle, genet, giraffe, hartebeest, hyrax, impala, klipspringer, kudu, Oryx, porcupine, warthog, waterbuck, zebra and many smaller species.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching, Camping, Trekking.

Amboseli National Park - "Home of the African Elephants"

Crowned by Mount Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest peak, the Amboseli National Park is one of Kenya's most popular parks. The name "Amboseli" comes from a Maasai word meaning "salty dust", and it is one of the best places in Africa to view large herds of elephants up close. The park encompasses 392km². It is a safari destination with an array and abundance of wildlife to experience. Amboseli is comprised of five different wildlife habitats.

These include open plains, yellow-barked acacia woodlands, Lava-strewn rocky thorn bush, swamps, and marshes. The Oldoinyo Orok massif stretches toward the skies reaching a height of 8,300 feet (2,760 m). Along with the herds of elephants, wildlife enthusiasts can hope for sightings of lion, cheetah, hyena, jackal, mongoose, giraffe, cape buffalo, warthog, baboon, monkey, zebra, impala, different species of gazelle, and more.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Bird watching, Camping, Photography.





Chyulu Hills National Park – “Green Hills of Africa”

Tucked away between Tsavo West National Park and Amboseli National Park, Chyulu Hills National Park boasts striking and diverse landscapes. It is a rugged wilderness still showing signs of its volcanic origins – and boasting some of the best views of Kilimanjaro. The park is a rugged jumble of ancient volcanic cones and craters, as well as the longest lava tube in the world. It encompasses 741km². Large mammals include buffalo, bushbucks, elands, elephants, leopards, giant forest hogs, bush pigs, reedbucks, and giraffes along with various reptiles and insects.

Park Activities; Bird watching, Camping, Game viewing, Horse riding, Mountain climbing.

Western Tourism Circuit

The western tourism circuit is the least visited and usually less crowded in Kenya. The western Kenya region consists of rich forests, swamps, and some of Kenya's rarest animal species.

The most fascinating attraction in this circuit is Lake Victoria, the biggest lake in East Africa.

It has four national parks and one national reserve, namely; Ruma National Park, Ndere Island National Park, Saiwa Swamp National Park, Kakamega Forest

National Reserve, and Mount Elgon National Park. Other attractions include the Kisumu Impala Sanctuary and Lake Simbi National Sanctuary.

Ruma National Park - “Dramatic Valley of the Roan Antelope and Oribi”

Ruma National park lies in Western Kenya, close to the shores of Africa's largest inland Lake, Lake Victoria. It is the only terrestrial park in Kenya's Nyanza Province, covering an area of 120km². Dubbed the "Last Retreat of the Roan Antelope", the park protects the only indigenous population of rare roan antelopes within Kenya. A mosaic of landscapes, ranging from riverine woodland and rolling savannah to magnificent escarpments and towering cliffs, Ruma National Park promises undiscovered wildlife treasures and undisturbed peace. Ruma's birdlife is exceptional.

The park is also the only protected area in Kenya where the globally threatened blue swallow, a scarce intra-African migrant, is regularly recorded. Blue swallows, which depend upon moist grassland for both feeding and roosting, arrive in Kenya from their breeding grounds in Southern Tanzania around April and depart again in September.

Park Activities; Bird watching and game viewing.

Ndere Island National Park – “Island of Serenity & Beauty”

The park is a small island on Africa's largest inland lake, the stunning Lake Victoria, covering an area of 4.2km². Ndere means "meeting place" in Dholuo. According to Luo folklore, early tribal migrants rested up near Ndere after their long journey

south up the Nile River Valley. They found the lush shoreline so pleasing that they stayed. Located on Lake Victoria, this island is a haven for birds. Covered mostly in grassland, Ndere Island provides beautiful scenic views of the Homa hills to the south, Mageta Island to the east and glimpses of Kampala in Uganda beyond the south west horizon. The lake shore supports a wide variety of animals including hippos, monitor lizards, Nile crocodiles, several fish species, snakes, baboons, impalas, the rare sitatunga antelopes, waterbucks, zebras, and warthogs. Over 100 different species of birds can be seen here including African fish eagles, black-headed gonoleks, and grey-headed kingfishers.

Park Activities; Bird watching, Hiking, Walking safaris



Mount Elgon National Park – “Untamed Wilderness, Secluded Splendor”

Mount Elgon National Park is located on the western side of Kenya along the border of Uganda where it shares sister protection with Uganda's Mount Elgon National Park under the same name. It covers an area of 169km². Mount Elgon is the pinnacle attraction within the park reaching a summit of 14,177 feet. It is believed to be the oldest extinct volcano in East Africa. The landscape of the park includes cliffs, waterfalls, caves, gorges, mesas, calderas, hot springs, and of course Mount Elgon mountain summits. Elephant, buffalo, bushbuck, antelope, duiker, giant forest hog, bush pig, and the beautiful black and white colobus monkeys are some of the more commonly seen wildlife species.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Hiking, Camping, Mountain climbing.

Kakamega Forest National Reserve – “Canopy of Natural Beauty”

Kakamega Forest is a tropical rainforest situated in Kakamega. It is Kenya's only tropical rainforest and is said to be Kenya's last remnant of the ancient Guinea-Congolian rainforest that once spanned the continent. It encompasses an area of 44.7km². This beautiful forest is home to various mammals including bush pigs, giant forest hedgehogs, colobus monkeys, Debrazzar monkeys, and pottos. Some of the birds to be seen here include the Blue Headed Bee Eater, Black Billed

Turaco, Turner's Eremomela, and Grey Parrots.

Park Activities; Bird watching, Hiking.

Coastline Tourism Circuit

Also known as the underworld paradise, this circuit is a well-known destination for beach holidays. Boasts with beautiful beach resorts, ideal for boat rides, snorkeling, windsurfing, deep-sea diving, and dhow trips – or just lazing around on the beach. The key tourist attractions along the Kenyan coast include beaches, cultural heritage, and marine-based habitats.



This circuit has various underwater reserves and two coastal forest reserves, namely; Watamu Marine National Reserve, Malindi Marine National Reserve, Kiunga Marine National Reserve, Mombasa Marine National Reserve, Kisite Mpunguti Marine National Reserve, Arabuko Sokoke Forest, and Shimba Hills National Reserve.

Watamu Marine National Park & Reserve – “Haven of the Green Turtle”

Watamu Marine National Park is located along the central part of the coast of Kenya and covers an area of 10km². It represents an underwater haven of corals, fish, and other aquatic marine life. The park is part of a complex of marine and tidal habitats along Kenya's north coast with rich and diverse birdlife, fish, turtles, and dugongs. The coral reef is comprised of 110 different species of stony coral and numerous crustaceans and mollusks. The diverse marine life earned the park a biosphere reserve

status as well as the UN World Biosphere Reserve recognition. The makeup of the coral reef includes 150 species of hard and soft corals that are home to over 500 species of fish.

The surrounding marine area increases the species of fish to around 1,000. Barracuda, Green turtles, Hawksbill turtles, Leatherback turtles, manta rays, octopus, Olive Ridley Turtles, and whale sharks are some of the more intriguing species that people like to encounter.

Activities; Diving, Sunbathing, Windsurfing, Glass Bottom boat rides, Water skiing.

Malindi Marine National Reserve – “The Coral Garden”

Malindi Marine National Reserve is claimed to be the oldest marine park in Africa, covering an area of 213km². From swimming with zebrafish to windsurfing,

this beautiful slice of Kenya's Indian Ocean coastline provides the

perfect getaway. The park is endowed with magnificent resources such as fringing reefs, coral gardens in the lagoons, seagrass beds, mangroves, mudflats, marine mammals, turtles, and various species of shorebirds.

Activities; Diving, Sunbathing, Windsurfing, Glass Bottom boat rides, Water skiing, Camping, Bird watching, Snorkeling. **Kisite Mpunguti Marine National Reserve – “Home of the Dolphins”**

Kisite-Mpunguti Marine National Park is situated on the southern coast of Kenya near Shimoni and south of Wasini Island in Kwale District near the Tanzanian border. Kisite park covers 11km² while Mpunguti reserve covers 28km².

Unspoiled, beautiful, and sun-kissed, the Kisite Marine Park was established to protect the scenic islands and special habitats of a wide range of

endemic marine animals and the breeding of migratory birds. It lies in the coral gardens south of Wasini Island and encompasses three small coral rag forest islands, each with considerable areas of fringing reef. Kisite is one of the most rewarding snorkeling locations at the coast.

Activities; Diving, Sunbathing, Camping, Bird watching, Snorkeling.

Mombasa Marine National Park & Reserve – “An Allure of natural beauty”

Mombasa Marine National Park and Reserve is a marine park and national reserve in Mombasa, Kenya. The park is 10km² while the reserve is 200km². The park lies between the Mtwapa and Tudor Creeks. Warm azure ocean, and swaying coconut



t palms on white sandy beaches are to be found in this park. The Marine Park is characterized by warm tropical conditions varying at the surface between 25 °C and 31 °C during the year, stable salinity regimes, and moderate nutrient levels. The reserve also provides a home to a variety of marine species including crabs, starfish, stonefish, cucumbers sea urchins, corals, turtles, seagrasses, and migratory birds including crab plovers.

Activities; Diving, Sunbathing, Water skiing, Windsurfing, Snorkeling

Kiunga Marine National Reserve- “An Enchanted Underwater World”

Kiunga Marine National Reserve is situated along the Indian Ocean coast of Lamu District, Coast Province, Kenya, the park covers 270km². This pristine ecosystem incorporates a chain of about 50 calcareous offshore islands and coral reefs in the Lamu Archipelago.

. The Coast is humid with mean annual temperatures ranging from 22 to 34 °C. The park boasts of teeming sea life in the coral reefs, seagrass, and extensive mangrove forests which are a refuge for sea turtles and dugongs.

Activities; Diving, Sunbathing, Water skiing, Windsurfing, Snorkeling

Arabuko Sokoke Forest Reserve

The Arabuko Sokoke Forest Reserve is a protected national forest reserve located on the coast of Kenya. The Arabuko Sokoke National Park, situated at the north-western edge of the Arabuko Sokoke Forest Reserve, is only a few km² in size and constitutes only a small portion of the latter.

This forest reserve covers an area of 420km². It contains three forest types, mixed forest, Brachystegia, and Cynometra, each of which protects different communities of plants and animals.





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Shimba Hills National Reserve – “Paradise of the Sable Antelope”

The Shimba Hills National Reserve is a small National Reserve located in the coastal region of Kenya, covering an area of 300km².

As one of the largest coastal forests in East Africa after Arabuko-Sokoke Forest, this reserve is rich in flora and fauna and hosts the highest density of African elephants in Kenya. The reserve is an area of coastal rainforest, woodland, and

grassland. The forest is an important bird area and is endowed with forest birdlife while the grasslands hold localized species such as red-necked-Spur fowl, Croaking Cisticola, and Zanzibar Red Bishop. The scenic Sheldrick Falls and the dense Mwaluganje Forest are also found here along with four campsites. Other animal species found in the area are Sable antelope, elephant shrew, bushy-tailed mongoose, and other small mammals like fruit bats.

Park Activities; Game viewing, Trekking, Archeological safaris.



Tanzania

Tanganyika (as it was originally known) was granted independence from Great Britain on 9th December 1961. In 1964 Tanganyika joined up with Zanzibar and then changed its name to the United Republic of Tanzania which is a blend of the two countries' names. Today, it is known as Tanzania.

The land of the great migration, Kilimanjaro and Zanzibar has some of Africa's biggest wildlife parks and most dramatic scenery. It is a land of many wonders, with an

unparalleled diversity of fauna and flora. Kilimanjaro, the highest permanently snow-capped free-standing mountain in Africa, the exotic Islands of Zanzibar, the finest game sanctuaries of Serengeti, Tarangire, Lake Manyara, Ngorongoro Crater, Ruaha, Selous, and the Marine Park of Mafia Island are only but a few of the living examples.

. The scenery, topography, and very friendly people harbor the growth of excellent cultural tourism, beach holidays, game hunting, historical and archaeological ventures – and certainly the best wildlife photographic safaris on the continent.

There's no question that Tanzania makes a sensational impact on almost every visitor, whether it's

The main options are Mikumi National Park, Ruaha National Park, Nyerere National Park, Udzungwa Mountain National Park, Kitulo National park,

3. Western Tanzania

Western Tanzania is in a league of its own with superb and contrasting wildlife experiences main options are: Katavi National park, Mahale Mountains National Park, and Gombe Stream National park

4. The Coast

Tanzania's b e a c h e s , especially those on its islands, are spectacular, accessible, and often relatively inexpensive to visit. There's a real choice of small beach lodges and hotels; consider the options:

Dar es Salaam, Bagamoyo, Saadani National Park, Pangani, Mafia Archipelago, Zanzibar Island (Pemba & Uguja)





Tanzania National Parks

Arusha National Park

Arusha National Park is one of the smaller and most beautiful National Parks in Tanzania. With an area of 137 sq. km, situated only 37 km from Arusha town, the park is very popular for day trips. The Ngurdoto Crater, Momela Lakes, the highland montane forest, and the rugged Mount Meru (4575 m above sea level) are the four distinctive features of the park.

Mt. Kilimanjaro, towering at 5895 m to the east, can be visible on clear days from many locations in the park. One of the unique attractions of the park is the opportunity to combine game drives and a nature walk in the many places where visitors can leave their safari vehicles and walk in the fresh air.

The most common animals found in this park are the Abyssinian black and white colobus monkeys, the Vervet monkeys, the red forest duikers, hippos, elephants, giraffes, buffaloes, bushbucks, and sometimes the leopard.

Tarangire National Park

This is a superb national park to visit all year round, however, visiting between June to September gives you access to a huge variety of animals. Tarangire offers a wide variety of wildlife in its area of 2,850 sq. km. As in all ecosystems, the vegetation and the types of animals you find are closely correlated.

The principal features of the park are the flood plains and the grassland, mainly comprising of various types of acacia trees, and a few scattered baobabs, tamarind, and sausage trees.

The Tarangire River, after which the park is named, provides the only permanent water for wildlife in the area. You may be lucky to spot the tree-climbing python, for which the park is famous, or the greater kudu and the roan antelope which are rare species in Northern Tanzania. Tarangire National Park is second only to Ngorongoro in the concentration of wildlife.



Lake Manyara National Park

Lake Manyara is one of Tanzania's most dazzling jewels and must be seen! It stretches for over 50 km (31 miles) along the Rift Valley. The park has a large variety of habitats, making it possible to support a wealth of wildlife in its small area. The main habitats include the shallow soda lake itself which occupies 77% of the National Park's total area of 330 sq. km, the groundwater forest, open grassland, acacia woodland, and the rift wall. The most famous spectacle in the park is the tree-climbing lions, which are occasionally seen along branches of acacia trees. Lake Manyara National Park is the only park where you can experience a night game drive which gives you a totally different perspective of the park and wildlife.

It's possible to do a light walking safari along the shores of the lake, guided by an experienced ranger. The walk takes about 3 hours and ends at the Maji moto kubwa hot springs.

Ngorongoro Conservation Area

Originally, The Ngorongoro Crater was volcanic and was formed approximately 20 million years ago as part of the Rift Valley. The rim of the crater is high, standing at 2220 m (1.4 miles) so take a jacket or sweater as it can get chilly! The steep walls at the side of the crater rise over 600 m from the floor and it is the most magical area in the conservation area guaranteed to enthrall every person who visits. The Ngorongoro Conservation area is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and International Biosphere Reserve which covers almost 8,300 km².

The crater is a stupendous natural wonder of the world and sits right in the middle of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area.

The bottom of the crater is renowned for incredible

opportunities to see the game; you could view some extremely rare animals (e.g. black rhino) as well as many different herds of animals. The Ngorongoro Crater, which is the central attraction in the area, is the largest Caldera in the world that has its walls intact. The sight of the Ngorongoro Crater is simply stunning. "It is impossible to give a fair description of the size and beauty of the Crater, for there is nothing with which one can compare it. It is one of the Wonders of the





World...” once wrote Professor Bernhard Grzimek. The crater floor is home to tens of thousands of plains animals, including wildebeest, zebra, gazelles, elands, and a large predator population of lions, hyenas, and jackal which can all be viewed at close quarters.

Serengeti National Park

Declared a protected area in 1921 and gazette as a National park in 1951, Serengeti is the oldest National Park in Tanzania and undoubtedly one of the most famous wildlife sanctuaries in the world. Covering an area of 14,763 sq. km, Serengeti National Park is the second-largest National Park in Tanzania after Ruaha. The park is located some 320 km to the northwest of Arusha and extends almost to Lake Victoria to the west. Aptly named “endless plains” by the Maasai people, you immediately experience this vastness as you

enter the southeastern plains of the park from Ngorongoro.

There is a variety of scenery, which include the plains, lakes, hills, and the rock outcrops called kopjes which you can even horseback Safari. From December, when the long rains start, to May, eastern Serengeti plains provide the best opportunities for game viewing as hundreds of thousands of migratory animals are concentrated in this part attracted by the short palatable grass. The Seronera valley in central Serengeti endowed with permanent surface water attracts a large concentration of wildlife throughout the year.

Common animals that can be seen here are lions, buffaloes, impalas, hippos, waterbucks, elephants, cheetahs, and leopards.

Mkomazi National Park

Mkomazi National Park is a hidden gem amongst the parks of Tanzania. Located in Northeastern Tanzania below the slopes of the Pare and the Usambara Mountains, Mkomazi extends to Tsavo National Park in Kenya and together these two parks form the Greater Tsavo Ecosystem with an area of 43,000 square kilometers. Although protected as Mkomazi and Uмба Game Reserves since 1951 it was only declared a national park in 2008 when Tanzania National Parks (TANAPA) took over management of this 3,200 square kilometer wilderness. Mkomazi National Park is one of the driest areas in Tanzania – in the local Pare language it means “little water” – yet still boasts incredibly diverse flora and fauna with a high endemic population of species. For this reason, a number of species found in Mkomazi are found nowhere else in Tanzania.

Mikumi National Park

Mikumi National Park covers an area of 3,230 sq km and is rich in wildlife including buffalo, wildebeest, zebra, lion, elephant, impala, hippos, baboon, giraffe, warthog, waterbuck, and eland which can be viewed throughout the year. Reptiles including crocodiles, monitor lizards, and pythons are also resident in the park. Other animals that can be sighted although rare are the Sable Antelope resident in the southern part of the park bordering the Selous, the Greater Kudu, the leopard, and the wild dog also known as the African Hunting Dog. More than 400 bird species have been recorded, including European migrants during the rainy season. Sharing a common border and



ecosystem with Selous Game Reserve to the south, Mikumi National Park is only a three to four hours drive from Dar es Salaam, lying astride the main highway to Zambia, and en route to the National Parks of the Udzungwa Mountains, Ruaha, and Kitulo. The main feature of the park is the Mikumi flood plain, along with the mountain ranges that border the park on two sides. Open grasslands dominate in the flood plain, eventually merging with the miombo woodland covering the lower hills



Udzungwa Mountains

Udzungwa Mountains National Park, Udzungwa, in particular, is of considerable scientific importance for its forest-swathed wilderness. Udzungwa Mountains is undoubtedly one of the few true virgins and unique forested lands remaining in the world. The major attractions include its biologically diverse forest, harboring some plant species found nowhere else in the world, from a tiny African violet to 30-meter high trees.

Apart from the forest, which acts as a water catchment area and has a large number of endemic species of

both animals and plants, the park has spectacular mountains scenery, grasslands, rocks, rivers, and waterfalls. One of the most interesting sights is the presence of two indigenous species of primates, the Iringa red colobus monkey and the Sanje Crested Mangabey, not known until 1979. Apart from providing habitat to about six species of primates, its plateau contains populations of elephants, buffalos, lions, leopards, African hunting dogs, and several forest bird species.



Day Trips

Kilimanjaro Day Hike

If you are not quite sure whether you are ready for a full Kilimanjaro adventure, you might want to take one of our shorter Kilimanjaro trips via the Marangu route. A one-day trip leads you up to Mandara Hut and back to the entry gate. On these hikes, you will reach the lower camps of Kilimanjaro, delve into the pristine tropical wilderness and see breathtaking landscapes around. The trail taken by the first Kilimanjaro explorers, Marangu is home to black-and-white colobuses living in the branches of tropical trees growing along the trail. This adventure is perfect if you travel with children who are not ready for the full hike yet, or if your holiday is too short but you still want to enjoy the trip.

Chemka Hot Springs

The hot springs of Kikuletwa, also known as Chemka Hot Springs, are close to the village of Rundugai. Chemka oasis is a unique phenomenon -where the groundwater actively interacted with geothermal sources, forming a number of small lakes with warm, never-stagnating water, which purity is not inferior to the best Dominican or Maldivian resorts. Sprawling fig trees surround the crystal-clear water that wells up from deep underground, giving the impression that it is boiling, hence the name "Hot Springs". The water is perfectly refreshing, the locals here call it a bathing basin.

Materuni Waterfalls

Materuni is the home of the Chagga tribe and is still an authentic tribal village in Northern Tanzania sitting at the foot of Mount Kilimanjaro. We will explore the beauty of the land and the cultural heritage of the Chagga people, where you will experience a traditional Chagga lunch and taste the local banana beer. The coffee experience awaits you. from coffee planting, drying and roasting, and further processed. You will also be invited to help with the grinding, which is traditionally accompanied by Chagga songs and dances - a fun way to immerse yourself in the local culture. Before you say goodbye you will be invited to taste the coffee you have just brewed



Uganda

The pearl of africa


Uganda is a landlocked country in East Africa whose diverse landscape encompasses the snow-capped Rwenzori Mountains and immense Lake Victoria. Its abundant wildlife includes chimpanzees as well as rare birds. Remote Bwindi Impenetrable National Park is a renowned mountain gorilla sanctuary. Murchison Falls National Park in the northwest is known for its 43m-tall waterfall and wildlife such as hippos.

It is a tough challenge to describe Uganda in a few short paragraphs. Despite the small size of the country, the diversity of landscape, topography, people, wildlife, birdlife, and plant life is mind-boggling.

If we had to distill the essence of Uganda right down to one word, we'd say 'Fecund'. This was used by Churchill all those years ago... but fecund are a few words we hear much anymore. Lush? Luxuriant? Abundant? Diverse? They all work.

Wrap all of this up with the rich cultural history and heritage of over 50 tribes – both Nilotic and Bantu – who live here and warmly welcome visitors, the ‘whole’ is great indeed.

Uganda National Parks

Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

Bwindi Impenetrable National Park (BINP) covers an area of 321 km² between 1,160m and 2,607m above sea level. It was gazetted as a National Park in 1991 and four years later was declared a UNESCO Natural World Heritage site. The first group of a gorilla to be habituated for tourism in Bwindi was the Mubare gorilla at Buhoma in April 1993. Fifteen groups in total have now been habituated for tourism and can be tracked from four trailheads. The world's primary mountain gorilla tracking destination is the Impenetrable Forest with fifteen groups habituated for Tourism. Forest trails lead to scenic waterfalls and rift valley viewpoints while community walks through local villages provide insights into the lives of the Batwa (Pygmy) and Bakiga people living beside the forest

Kibale National Park

Kibale National park is best known for its number and variety of primates, including Uganda's largest population of chimpanzees. Kibale's varied altitude supports different types of habitats ranging from tropical forest to woodland and savannah on the rift valley floor. The Forest is one of Africa's foremost research sites for tropical forest biology.

The park is best known for its primates which include chimpanzees, the localized red colobus, and L'Hoest's monkeys. There are two tourism sites in Kibale NP. The main hub is at **Kanyanchu**, located 35km southeast of Fort Portal on a newly tarmacked road leading to Kamwenge and Ibanda. A secondary site is at Sebitoli, 16km east of Fort Portal on the Kampala road.

Kidepo valley

Kidepo National park was first gazetted as a game reserve and upgraded to national park status in 1962. Kidepo is one of East Africa's last great wildernesses. The Kidepo landscape is one of tremendous drama with grasslands roamed by big game favorites extending towards rugged mountains at all points of the compass.

It is an area of rich cultural interest for the plains around the park are dotted with the manyattas (homesteads) of Karamoja's fiercely traditional pastoralists. The park consists of two broad, shallow valleys; Narus and Kidepo

Queen Elizabeth

Queen Elizabeth National Park is one of Uganda's oldest protected areas. It was originally gazetted as the Lake George and Lake Edward game reserves in 1925 and later upgraded to create one of Uganda's first national parks in 1952. A pair of concrete hoops marks the spot where the Equator line crosses the Kasese road.

The park is home to over 95 mammal species and over 600 bird species. The park was initially named Kazinga National Park in 1952 but was renamed two years later to commemorate a visit by Queen Elizabeth II.

Murchison Falls National Park

Originally gazetted as the Bunyoro and Gulu Wildlife Reserve in 1926, it was upgraded to form one of Uganda's first national parks in 1952. At Murchison Falls, the Nile explodes through a 6m wide gorge

and plunges 45m into the 'Devil's Cauldron.'

The park is bisected by the Victoria Nile which races west through the park for 80km, descending a series of rapids before exploding through a narrow (6m) gap in the remnant rift valley cliffs.

This 45m plunge drains the last of the river's energy transforming the torrent into a broad, placid stream that flows quietly across the rift valley floor towards Lake Albert.

The 1951 film "The African Queen" starring Humphrey Bogart was filmed on Lake Albert and the Nile below Murchison Falls. Other notable visitors to the park include Winston Churchill, Theodore Roosevelt, Ernest Hemingway, and several British royals.



The Rwenzori Mountains Park

The Rwenzori Mountains park was gazetted in 1991 and was recognized as a World Heritage site in 1994 and Ramsar site in 2008. Its highest point is on Mt Stanley's Margherita Peak at 5109m above sea level. Unlike other Volcanic Mountains in East Africa, The Rwenzori is not volcanic but is a block of rock up-faulted through the floor of the Western Rift Valley.

The Rwenzoris were christened the "Mountains of the Moon" by the Alexandrine geographer Ptolemy in AD 150. Its name locally means "Rain-Maker" or "Cloud-King" as labeled by Henry Stanley in 1888. Ms. Beryl Park aged 78 in 2010 reached the Margherita Peak and was recorded as the oldest person to reach the peak.

The Rwenzoris – the fabled Mountains of the Moon – lie in western Uganda along the Uganda-Congo border.

Mgahinga National Park

Mgahinga national park is the smallest park in Uganda and protects mountain gorillas and other fauna on the Ugandan slopes of the Virunga volcanoes. Mgahinga Gorilla National Park sits high in the clouds, at an altitude of between 2,227m and 4,127m. As its name suggests, it was created to protect the rare mountain gorillas that inhabit its dense forests, and it is also an important habitat for the endangered golden monkey. Mgahinga's most striking features are its three conical, extinct volcanoes, part of the spectacular Virunga Range that lies along the border region of Uganda, Congo, and Rwanda.

AFRICAN GIANTS SAFARI

2 Nights 3 Days

DAY 1: Nairobi | Tsavo East National Park

Early morning pick-up, drive to Tsavo East National Park, a famous Kenya safari destination known for largest Elephant herds in the country, as well as large prides of Lions. One of the Park's most recognizable features is the Yatta Plateau which is the longest lava flow in the World, stretching for over 300km (185 miles). Another attraction is the Lugards Falls, where the Galana River cascades over a series of rapids created by interestingly shaped rocks. Arrive in time for lunch, enjoy afternoon game drives, and return to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 2: Tsavo West National Park

After breakfast, drive to Tsavo West National Park, arriving in time for lunch. This park is historically famous for the Man-eaters of Tsavo, two maneless Lions that developed a taste for human prey during the early 1900's. Enjoy afternoon game drives where you can drive up to some brilliant vantage points like Poachers Lookout, where you may see as far as Mount Kilimanjaro on a clear day. Head to the clear waters of the Mzima Springs for a glimpse of crocodiles and hippos in an underground lookout, or to the Ngulia Rhinoceros Sanctuary, one of the few places in the country where it is possible to view the majestic black rhino. Return back to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3: Tsavo West National Park | Depart

Today, after breakfast, check out and depart to Nairobi, game viewing drives enroute. Arrive late afternoon with an onward transfer to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for your outbound flights. End of services.



THE BIG 5 SAFARI

2 Nights 3 Days

DAY 1: Nairobi | Maasai Mara National Reserve

Early morning pick-up, drive along the floor of the famous Great Rift Valley to the Maasai Mara. Along the way, you'll stop at the Great Rift Valley viewpoint for a stunning panorama of the lakes, plains, and volcanic terrain that dominate the region. You'll later stop in the Maasai town of Narok to stretch your legs before continuing on to Kenya's most famous reserve. Arrive in time for lunch, enjoy afternoon game drives, and return to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 2: Maasai Mara National Reserve

Wake before the dawn for the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to witness a Maasai Mara sunrise. After a quick cup of coffee, you'll head out into the park to watch as the sun sets fire to the savannah and the big cats take advantage of the morning cool to search for a



meal. You'll then return to your lodge for a late breakfast before packing a picnic lunch and heading back out into the park for a day-long exploration of this reserve. You can opt to visit to Maasai Village and learn about the uniqueness of Maasai tribe and their culture at an extra cost. Return back to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3: Maasai Mara National Reserve | Depart

This morning, after breakfast, check out and depart to Nairobi, game viewing drives enroute. Arrive in the afternoon with an onward transfer to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for your outbound flights. End of services.



THE SAMBURU MAGIC SAFARI

2 Nights 3 Days

DAY 1: Nairobi | Samburu National Reserve

Early morning pick-up, depart and drive north through to the northern frontier district and on to Samburu Game Reserve, arriving in time for lunch, enjoy afternoon game drives, and return to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight. The reserve is rich in wildlife with fame for abundance in rare northern specialist species such as the Grevy's Zebra, Somali Ostrich, Reticulated Giraffe, Gerenuk and the Beisa Oryx (Also referred as Samburu Special). The reserve is also popular with a minimum of 900 elephants. Large predators such as the Lion, Leopard and Cheetah are an important attraction (Kamunyak the Miracle Lioness that adapted the baby Oryx is a resident in the reserve).

DAY 2: Samburu National Reserve

Spend this whole day exploring Samburu Game Reserve with early morning game drive where the light is perfect for a good photographic scenery coupled with the concentration of wildlife on the ground, mid-morning game drives and afternoon game drives where you will have the opportunity of spotting all the three cats including lions, leopards and cheetahs. You will have an option of going out with picnic lunch boxes to spend the entire whole day in this reserve. You can have an optional visit to Samburu Village and learn about the uniqueness of Samburu tribe and their culture at an extra cost. . Return back to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3: Samburu National Reserve | Depart

This morning, embark on an early morning game drive on sunrise when predators are active and later return to the lodge for breakfast. After breakfast, check out and depart to Nairobi, game viewing drives enroute. Arrive in the afternoon with an onward transfer to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for your outbound flights. End of services.



THE SATAO SAFARI

2 Nights 3 Days

DAY 1: Nairobi | Tsavo West National Park

Early morning pick-up, drive to Tsavo West National Park, a famous Kenya safari destination known for the Man-eaters of Tsavo, two maneless Lions that developed a taste for human prey during the early 1900's. Arrive in time for lunch. Enjoy afternoon game drives where you can drive up to some brilliant vantage points like Poachers Lookout, where you may see as far as Mount Kilimanjaro on a clear day. The Park is a vast expansion of African savanna with a more diverse array of habitats which include open plains, semi desert scrub, woodland, Chyulu Hills and rock outcrops. Return to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 2: Tsavo West National Park

Two game drives are scheduled for this day, a morning and an early evening game drive. The extensive diverse habitats offer ideal area

to search for pride of Lions, Buffaloes, Cheetahs, Giraffe, Zebras, Hippos and Wildebeests. Head to the clear waters of the Mzima Springs for a glimpse of crocodiles and hippos in an underground lookout, or to the Ngulia Rhinoceros Sanctuary, one of the few places in the country where it is possible to view the majestic black rhino. There is also a wealth and diversity of birds' species. Return back to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3: Tsavo West National Park | Amboseli National Park



Enjoy an early morning game drive before returning to your lodge/camp for breakfast. Later check out and proceed to Amboseli National park arriving in time for lunch. Enjoy afternoon game drive within Amboseli which lies at the floors of Mount Kilimanjaro which offers scenic backgrounds for photography. Clouds may open up and the sight of the snow peaked Mt. Kilimanjaro will leave you mesmerized. Elephants, Lions, Cheetah, Buffalo etc. can be seen at the swamp area. Dinner and overnight at your lodge/camp.



THE EXCLUSIVE MASAI MARA SAFARI

4 Nights 5 Days

AY 4: Amboseli National Park

You will be early again! The sunrise and emergence of the mountain peak from the clouds is dramatic. You will marvel at the vistas as you enjoy your breakfast. The whole day is yours to explore the vast: Amboseli National Park, an area of natural beauty and high biodiversity. Head out for your morning game viewing drive in Amboseli returning to the lodge/camp for lunch. Later in the afternoon drive out for yet another game viewing drive on this majestic backdrop to one of Kenya's most spectacular displays of wildlife. Return back to your lodge/camp for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5: Amboseli National Park| Depart

This morning, after breakfast, check out and depart to Nairobi, game viewing drives enroute. Arrive late afternoon with an onward transfer to Jomo Kenyatta International Airport for your outbound flights. End of services.

DAY 1: Nairobi | Masai Mara National Reserve

Arrive in Nairobi where you will be transferred to Wilson Airport to catch a 45-minute flight to Masai Mara. Your Masai guide will meet you at the airstrip and transfer you to our camp/lodge in Masai Mara. Enjoy lunch and make plans to settle in for the rest of the afternoon. Your late afternoon will be spent exploring the reserve in 4x4 open land cruisers as you marvel at the area's wildlife and views.

DAY 2 &3 : Masai Mara National Reserve Dawn Game Drives

Rise early for a morning game drive in Masai Mara Reserve. Enjoy driving across the vast Mara Plains and keep your eyes open, for anything is possible! Watch out for the herd of elephants and listen to the distinctive lion's roar.



Head back to camp/lodge for breakfast. After lunch and relaxation, enjoy afternoon game drives in search for the big five. Return to your camp/lodge before dusk for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5: Mara National Park | Depart

Optional activities can be arranged for you during your stay, like a Balloon ride which we highly recommend. Where you liftoff at dawn rising with the sun and gently floating in whichever direction the winds of the morning take you. At times this balloon will be piloted at the treetop level offering unique perspectives of the wildlife and many great photo opportunities.

OR

Wake up for a final morning game drive. Return to camp for breakfast. Take some time to gather your belongings. After lunch, say your goodbyes and check out as you cherish the memories and reflect on your memorable safari experience. Enjoy one last game drive on your way to Ol Seki Airstrip where you will catch your flight to Nairobi, as you depart think of the memories of communing with man and nature.

On arrival, Silver Africa Tours and Safaris driver guide will drop you at your hotel or airport to catch your flight back home. End of services.

DAY 4: Mara Walking Safari Adventure

Start your day with a well-deserved breakfast then depart on a half-day walking safari across the savannah. Walking with the Maasai is an unforgettable experience that is only allowed inside private conservancies such as Naboisho. You will move at a relaxed pace observing wildlife behavior and interactions. Spend two to three hours following game paths then have a short rest under the clear blue African skies. Enjoy snack delights before resuming your walk.

Return to your camp/lodge in time for lunch. After lunch, enjoy some downtime in your room as you take in panoramic views of the conservancy from the spacious tents. Later, join your guide for an afternoon game drive to witness some of the wildlife Mara Naboisho

is known for. Return to camp/lodge in time for a mouth-watering three-dinner, followed by story sharing and stargazing around the fireplace.

THE GREAT LAKES SAFARI

5 Nights 6 Days

DAY 1: Nairobi | Aberdares National Park

Early morning pick-up, drive north to the Mt. Kenya region. This will be a relaxed drive with your driver pointing out any new sightings on the way. Arrive at your lodge in time for lunch. Later in the afternoon you will be transferred to Aberdares National Park where you will overnight at Tree Hotel. Evening game viewing at a floodlit waterhole; watch animals as they come for water and scratch for salt from the comfort of your lodge.

DAY 2: Aberdares National Park| Lake Bogoria

After an early morning breakfast, check out and take a scenic drive to Lake Bogoria Via Thompson's Falls where you will stop to view the scenic waterfalls. Proceed via tea/coffee plantation arriving in time for lunch at Lake Bogoria. In the afternoon, proceed to the reserve for a view of the hot springs and Geysers. Return back to your resort for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3: Lake Bogoria| Lake Nakuru| Lake Naivasha


Leaving Bogoria, you travel to Lake Nakuru, arriving in time for lunch. Lake Nakuru is known as an ornithological paradise by birdwatchers because the lake is world-famous as the location of the greatest bird spectacle on earth which boasts anywhere between one and two million lesser and greater pink flamingos that feed on the abundant algae thriving in the



lake's warm waters. Proceed to Lake Naivasha where you can opt to enjoy afternoon boat rides. Lake Naivasha is famous for its high populations of hippos and flamingos. There are over 1,500 hippos in the area, and you are almost guaranteed to see one. The lake is a birder's paradise as it is home to over 400 bird species. Dinner and overnight at your lodge/camp.

DAY 4: Lake Naivasha| Maasai Mara National Reserve

Early breakfast signals your departure for the Maasai Mara. Make it to the Maasai Mara for late lunch and an afternoon game drive. The Mara reserve has an extraordinary density of animals; including the Big five and an array of plains game. The Mara River cuts through the Mara-Serengeti ecosystem giving life to the two game reserves before pouring out into Lake Victoria. The highlight of this safari is the instinct-led migration of wildebeest, zebra and gazelle from the Serengeti to the Maasai Mara. The predator-prey spectacle is even more thrilling on a game drive as you watch the animals outrun their predators in close proximity. The Mara sunset spices up your sundowner before retiring to your camp/lodge for the night.



DAY 5: Maasai Mara National Reserve

Spend the whole day in game viewing. The scenic appeal of the tree-studded savannah plains, the moderate climate, and diversity of wild game species make it a one-stop point for game viewing. Look out for the “BIG FIVE”, Predators, Star Ventures and much more as they roam freely in this game reserve. Picnic lunch shall be by the Mara river as we watch hippos & crocodiles or maybe the great migration river crossing [July-September]. Return to your lodge in the evening for Dinner and overnight.

DAY 6: Maasai Mara National Reserve | Depart

DAY 1: ARRIVAL - WELCOME

After breakfast, and a safari briefing this morning, we will drive towards the Ngorongoro Conservation Area. The driving safari will take you through the bustling town of Arusha before heading in a westerly direction, passing small settlements and perhaps a trading market. When passing through the small town of Mto wa Mbu, look out for bicycles laden with large clusters of bananas. A game drives through Lake Manyara National Park offers an immediate immersion into the bush and wildlife of Tanzania.

The park centers around a large alkaline lake which attracts a variety of birdlife throughout the year, including greater and lesser pink flamingos between November and April, as well as pelicans, storks, herons, and the flightless hippo. We arrive at the park in time for a picnic lunch then set out for an afternoon game drive and hope to see the park's famous tree-climbing lions.

A wealth of birdlife and large game roam the park and its lake, with the cliffs of the Great Rift Valley forming a stunning backdrop to it all. Enjoy lunch and a cold drink at lake Manyara Serena before continuing your journey toward Ngorongoro. We drive to Ngorongoro Conservation Area and check in at and beyond Ngorongoro crater Lodge. Consistently recognized as one of the world's most luxurious and elegant places to stay, Where Maasai meets



Versailles, themed in romance, on the rim of Ngorongoro's ancient caldera.

We arrive at the lodge in time for a scenic dinner.

DAY 3: CRATER TOUR

After breakfast, the driver guides your vehicle nearly 2,000 feet down into Ngorongoro Crater for a full day of exploration. In addition to viewing the larger game, we will drive across the dense forest on the rim to soda lake to view the outstanding birdlife. Today, we enjoy a picnic lunch in the crater itself.

The Ngorongoro Crater floor is wonderful because you can see thousands of animals in a single visit. Ngorongoro crater: Known as "Africa's Garden of Eden", the crater is undoubtedly the best place in Tanzania to see black rhinos as well as the pride of lions with magnificent black-maned males. By mid-afternoon, it's time to start the return journey up the walls of the caldera to the rim, and onwards back to camp for a chance to freshen up and enjoy a drink in the bar before dinner.

Day 5: SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

This morning, we set out after an early breakfast amongst the splendor of an African sunrise for a full day of game viewing. Negotiating the roads and tracks away from the camp, you are transported into a world of a timeless natural wonder; one where the sights, sounds, and

pageantry of life continue just as they have for thousands of years.

As the day progresses, your driver's deep knowledge of the land becomes apparent as he leads you to one spot of outstanding beauty after the next, allowing you to observe the wildlife quietly and at your leisure. As the animals take refuge from the hot mid-day sun, we find a secluded spot to stop and enjoy a picnic lunch before pressing on. You arrive back at the camp at dusk, pleasantly tired after an exhilarating day. After a well-deserved hot shower, you head to the camp for dinner.

Day 6: SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK

After breakfast, we drive to the secluded corner of the salient Serengeti, located in the legendary Western Corridor, typically where the wildebeest are found from late May to July, When the wildebeest are in the Western Corridor, a full-day game drive can allow you to view the Migration scattered in the woodland against a hilly backdrop. This region is also where the wildebeest rut (mating season) takes place and where the herds must cross the tree-lined Grumeti River, reputedly home to some of the largest crocodiles in Africa.

Day 7: HOT AIR BALLOON DAY

You will be picked up very early in the morning for your balloon lounge site. Where you lift off at dawn, rise with the sun and gently float in whichever direction the winds of the morning take you. Now the burner is really ignited by the pilot and some violent bursts hiss into the balloon envelope.

After these powerful burner bursts, the hot air balloon rises in the air. Slowly, the surrounding bushes and trees are getting smaller and the balloon ride begins punctually at sunrise. You see a fantastic backdrop.

The first pictures are taken and it does not take long before you can see other hot air balloons gliding over the Serengeti Plains. At times this balloon will be piloted at the treetop level offering unique perspectives of the wildlife and many great photo opportunities. Depending on the wind direction and wind force, the balloon hovers over acacia trees and bushes. The balloon safari will impress all participants - an experience that you will not forget. After about 1 hour, it is time to take the position in the basket for the landing.

After the safe landing, you will be invited to a pre-prepared idyllic spot in Grumeti for a first-class breakfast. But before you come to the picnic in the wilderness, everyone will take the opportunity to take one or more photos of the balloon you just used for the exciting balloon safari.

Afterward, champagne breakfast with hot tea or coffee. Of course, every balloonist gets a certificate to prove his balloon ride over the Serengeti. After this sumptuous

breakfast, all guests will be driven back to their camp, where they will arrive at noon and then continue the Serengeti Safari depending on the program.

Overnight: Beyond Grumeti River Lodge

Day 8: SERENGETI NATIONAL PARK-ZANZIBAR

After breakfast, fly to the beautiful island of Zanzibar and transfer to the hotel. Enjoy an orientation walk with your CEO in historic Stone Town, and opt to continue on for a longer walking tour, or explore on your own. Transfer to the airport for a short, but scenic flight to this island paradise. Arrive in Stone Town in time for lunch and an orientation walk.
